#### ***ABOUT THE SPEAKER***

Lynn Turner is the Chief Accountant of the Securities and Exchange Commission. His responsibilities include the oversight of U.S. accounting and auditing standards, coordination of international accounting standards, and professional independence issues.

Prior to joining the SEC in July, 1998, Mr. Turner was Chief Financial Officer and Vice President of Symbios, Inc., an international semiconductor and storage manufacturer, from June 1996 to June 1998. Between 1976 and 1991 he was a partner with Coopers & Lybrand (C&L). With the exception of a two-year

appointment with the SEC, Mr. Turner held positions of increasing responsibility with C&L including assignments in the C&L National Office and as National Practice Leader of the High Technology Audit Practice.

During the course of his career, Mr. Turner served on many standard setting task forces, wrote case studies and articles, taught accounting, and served on the advisory boards of venture capitalists, not-for-profit organizations and the SEC Institute. He is a member of the AICPA and the Financial Executives Institute. Mr. Turner holds an MA in Accounting from the University of Nebraska and a BA from Colorado State University.
