# Cohen Arts & Culture Experience

## **Overview**

The primary purpose of the Cohen Arts and Cultural Experience (CACE) is to expose Stern freshmen to the rich diversity of artistic and cultural programming in New York City. The secondary and tertiary goals are to foster a sense of community among participants, and to connect student participants with their peers, faculty, and administration via memorable artistic and cultural experiences.

This year, CACE has been incorporated into the Fall 2014 Cohort Leadership Program's (CLP) syllabus so as to allow all freshmen the opportunity to gain exposure to the rich artistic and cultural diversity of New York City. In their cohorts, students will have a choice between three quintessential New York City arts and culture experiences. Led by Stern faculty, staff, and a CLP Guide (an upper-year Stern student), 20-25 students per cohort group will engage in a unique CACE event. Through this semester-long program, students will learn more about their fellow cohort members, their faculty, Stern UC staff, and the New York City arts and culture scene.

## **Participation Information**

- Each event will have 20-25 students guided by three faculty or staff members
- Each participating faculty or staff member may bring one additional guest (i.e., partner, friend, etc.)
- Following the registration period, The Office of Student Engagement will confirm all event details with participants, including tickets, attendance lists, and other reservation information
- To encourage student-faculty and student-staff connections, the OSE has organized "CACE Connections." CACE
  Connections serve as pre-departure meetings; participating faculty and staff members will meet with participating
  students one hour prior to the event's start time at a designated Stern UC classroom
- CACE Connection logistics (i.e. meeting time and location) will be communicated to all CACE participants at least one week prior to the CACE event
