Overview

- Each event will have 15-20 students guided by one faculty or staff member
- Each participating faculty or staff member may bring one additional guest (i.e., partner, friend, etc.)
- Following the registration period, The Office of Student Engagement will confirm all event details with participants, including tickets, attendance lists, and other reservation information
- In order to build community and manage logistics, we ask that participating faculty and staff members meet with students one hour prior to the event's start time at Gould Plaza (if weather conditions permit, directly in front of Tisch Hall and if weather conditions are poor, inside the Tisch Hall lobby)
- Faculty and staff members should pick up all tickets for the event one day prior to event in the Office of Student Engagement
